Almondsbury Charity is a local charity which can trace its origins back to medieval times but still provides help for people and organisations who live or meet within the parish of Almondsbury as it existed in 1881

This includes Almondsbury (including Hortham Village) Patchway, Charlton Hayes, part of Pilning, Easter Compton and Bradley Stoke (north of Tesco).

Recently the charity has bought furniture, beds, carpets, washing machines and refrigerators for people with limited resources. The charity regularly gives grants to primary schools to enable pupils from low income families to take part in Year 6 school visits, as well as supporting students in Higher Education. Help has also been given to groups to enable them to provide activities for children during the pandemic.
