PILNING & SEVERN BEACH PARISH COUNCIL

Meeting held on Monday 7th February 2011, commencing at 6.30 pm

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At 6.30 pm, Paul Godwin, Youth Service Area Manager, together with colleague Trace Hindle, spoke with members regarding the local service. There have been changes to the administrative area and the most recent service into SB ran into difficulties. In effect the service was so popular that attendance numbers were too great for the available staff to deal with. Meeting with the SB VH committee, various options have been considered and it appears that a good compromise has been reached.

When staff recruiting is completed it is likely the youth bus will be visiting the field on Mondays, between 6.15 and 8.15 pm. Recently the bus has parked by the burger bar but bad weather and poor advertising has led to very poor attendances. Currently: local youngsters are being contacted; a grant of £1,900 from Safer, Stronger Communities is imminent; and, new parameters are to be set regarding the age of attendees – likely to be set at 13 to 15. In other areas it is possible to hold meetings for different age groups on different days. With only 1 day scheduled locally it has been necessary to limit to the age group that is most needy and likely to gain the greatest benefit from the experience. It is hoped the local beat officer will be involved

Questioned regarding the use of the funding, it was confirmed that various courses were likely to be arranged, as were trips to various established facilities in other areas. The fund would not stretch far in such circumstances. On a local basis it is hoped that coaching in various sporting activities can be organised. PG has seen the parish plan document and is fully aware of the 'wish list' established by those youngsters who responded to the questionnaire.

At 6.55 pm, with no further enquiries forthcoming, PG and TH departed, with the promise of an update on progress with the initiative, and with the thanks of the council

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The Chairman asked those present to remember Dave Priddle, formerly of Ableton Court, and Mrs Hutchings (née Waft), who moved out of the parish more than 70 years ago but was intensely proud of her local roots (her grandfather, the Reverend J F E Holloway, was the first chairman of the parish council)
