Progress update:

• A big thankyou to everyone who completed the public survey, which closed on 3^{rd} January. We received 408 responses representing a rate of return of 27%. A subgroup is now working on the analysis of the data, the results of which will be presented publically in due course.

• Work has commenced on approaching businesses, organisations and groups in our community in order to understand their needs and expectations for the Parish. If you are a good point of contact for any of these, please let us know.

• Due to savings in delivering the public survey, we have considered where our grant funding could be redirected and are awaiting Government confirmation of the availability of grants for next year.

Next steps:

• Using evidence provided by the residents for each of the topics in the survey, we will produce specific 'aims and objectives' for the Neighbourhood Development Plan. These will say what we aim to include and why. This will be presented with the survey results to the residents in various public forums.

• Through the survey, residents have identified potential sites for development (not just for housing!). These have been added to sites already identified by the Steering Group and all will be evaluated for suitability for particular purposes over the coming months.

• A number of studies will be commissioned to further substantiate the Neighbourhood Plan's proposals, through Locality (the national network supporting community organisations) or South Gloucestershire Council. These may include; design codes, site assessment, flood risk and characterisation of the neighbourhood.
