416. SOIL DUMP, SEWERAGE PLANT AREA

The Councillors wish it to be ascertained when work on the Soil Dump is to commence, and Sewerage Plant Site levelled and seeded. wish a Warning Notice to be placed near to the grass area in front of Nos. 17-23 Chessel Avenue.

GORMLEY'S CAFE. 474.

This Cafe still being an eyesore, and windows being covered by galvanised sheets, the Councillors wish to find out what is to take place there in future to dispose of this blot on Severn Beach.

AUST ROAD, NORTHWICK. 493.

A special letter is to be sent to the R.D.C. pressing for resurfacing the road, restoring the verges and piping the ditch for use as a car standage area.

511. NORTHWICK CHURCH.

Councillors Ball, Lewis and Snell are to visit the church area and inspect. A quantity of stone from the demolition is still on the site, for what reason is not certain, and this is to be investigated.

The Glos. Highways Dept. is to be asked if the road past the School

extends to the boundary of the churchyard entrance.

535 SEVERN BEACH HALL PROJECT.

Mr. Denner reported on negotiations regarding cost of Hall with the prospective builders. The Clerk reported the District Auditors required a more satisfactory agreement made between the Parish Council and Hall Committee, such as:

Giving amount of Loan (£2060).

If loan to be free of Interest.

Length of repayment period (40 years).

Date of first repayment 29th September 1973 and subsequent half-yearly payments of £51.75 to be paid on 25th March and 29th September each year. The Parish Council to hold the Deeds of the Hall as Security.

The Councillors decided an Agreement should be prepared on these lines by the Chairman and Clerk. The Agreement to be signed by the Chairman and Treasurer of the Hall Committee and the Chairman of the Parish Council.

558. PILNING TIP.

SEATS ON PROMENADE, SEVERN BEACH.

There were some suggestions given to rid the seats of the green fungus, and it was decided to try Red Cuprinol as a deterrant and wood preserver. Mr. Ball will have this tried out and report at a later date.
