Minutes	Minutes of meeting not to be read or signed.
Chairman	In the absence of the Chairman & Vice Chairman, Mr Lewis acted in this place. The Clerk reported he could not read the minutes of the previous meeting, the Minute Book, & various documents, being in the hands of Auditors for the yearly audit at Thornbury, he however, gave a list of the subjects of the May Minutes for the information & use of Councillors present.
Insurance of Councillors etc	It was decided to complete the Insurance with the Cornhill Insurance Coy (as so advised by the Parish Council's agent) under the Parish Councils amalgamated Insurance scheme. The policy costs approximately the same as that held previously with another Insurance Coy.
Motor mower	This machine has been purchased at a cost of £38.15.6 & has proved satisfactory. The Councillors authorised a sum of £1-0-0 to be paid to the Comelony Caretaker for the provision of petrol which he has been supplying for the past four years, without making any claim.
Eastfield Rd to Northwick Rd.	The surface of the pavement between these points, had been left with a surface of large chippings after the new coast Rd was opened. The pavement surface being too rough to be walked upon, children going to & from Northwick School & local residents therefore had to use the main road. This was considered dangerous & the District Surveyor is to be asked if he can have the pavement surfaced with Tarmac.
Landscaping the Coast Rd near Redwick Estate	The County Surveyor wrote to state he had noted suggestions made by the Parish Council, & these will be considered for possible inclusion in the future landscaping proposals for the new road.
Faulted ditch Bank Rd.	Mr Huntingdon the Public Health Inspector, has inspected the ditch & approached Mr Northover, who is willing to cooperate in preventing a nuisance arising this coming summer.
Bus Stop outside nos 43/45 Redwick Rd.	Mr Andain informed the Council he had written to the Occupier of No 43 that in the opinion of the Highway Authority, the Bus Stop, the Police that no better siting could be found & the resident could if still aggrieved write to the Traffic Commissioners - Bristol & appeal. The Councillors wished it to be recorded that the erection of the Bus stop had been carried out in a very high handed manner & reckless manner, the post being erected before Y.M., but they could do no more.
Weeds in pavement Swanmoor	Mr Parsons had reported the nuisance had been dealt with.
Litter Bin at new Passage	A strong complaint had been received that the litter bin near the Little Peeble Beach, New Passage had not been emptied for a very long time, & paper & other rubbish was left lying around. The Clerk phoned Mr Davison who stated he would get this done in future. Mr Davison was also informed that a much larger bin was required & the Clerk ordered 2 more bins as three seats had been erected nearby, within the past few days. The Councillors approved the action taken.
Pilning Tip	It was agreed to send Mr Frost a reminder that a meeting had not yet been arranged by him at the site, for a discussion on the ways & means the Tip could be improved in appearance.
