2b Declarations of Interest

To receive declarations of interest under the Localism $Act\ 2011$ – being any pecuniary interest in agenda items not previously recorded on Members' Register of Interests. None

3a) To decide on a response to the phase 3 Local Plan consultation.

ND gave a summary and took questions on what the 3rd phase of the local plan is setting out to achieve and that this is a South Gloucestershire wide consultation. The third phase seeks to set out the preferred strategy.

Summary of the issues discussed.

- Flood zone 3 precludes the area from any housing development.
- PSB3 in this parish seeks to allocate land to the North of Marsh Common Road for industrial
 use.
- The draft local plan appears to seek to vary the green belt, but it is not clear that exceptional circumstances are evidenced and justified.
- There is no shortage of employment land within the parish with some 300 acres of greenfield land allocated for employment use with an extant planning consent.
- Also over 100 acres of brownfield (previously developed) land within the safeguarded employment area.
- B4055 road is wholly inadequate for any additional traffic, certainly not additional heavy goods vehicles. A particular issue exists with the weak and narrow Bristol Road Bridge over the main line railway.
- Concerns were raised that goods traffic would be running twenty-four hours a day to serve the development.

- The proposal would see a business park style development including industrial, offices and warehouses.
- One aspect of the proposal is for sustainable transport to be available; VB has spoken to
 the transport dept. at South Glos but there are no sensible or viable plans to achieve this
 objective. For example, a shuttle bus from Severn Beach railway station was suggested by
 South Glos.
- Although not in Pilning & Severn Beach Parish, the huge development proposed at Easter Compton / Compton Greenfield should not be underestimated.
- Criticism was raised against how difficult it is to find the consultation pages on the South Glos website.

Resolved for the Clerk to put the relevant links on the front page of the Parish Council website

Action JE

- Given the already extensive land raising on Western Approach and more recently on land between Marsh Common Road and the M49; concerns were raised that further land raising would take place on the proposed development site. Flooding has worsened in recent years and residents fear that if the land is raised between Marsh Common Road and the railway line, homes will be under a much greater threat of flooding.
- It was noted that the Local Plan acknowledges the existence of the emerging Neighbourhood Plan for Pilning & Severn Beach.

Travellers

 The Parish Council recognise and support the need to allocate sites for the traveller community in the same way that sites are allocated for housing. The proposal to safeguard existing authorized sites and in particular the proposal to remove existing sites from the green belt is noted.

Omissions

- The desperate need for a truck stop was noted. The welfare of the vehicle drivers must be
 considered and that adequate facilities provided for them. The truck stop needs to be of
 sufficient size to accommodate the number of HGVs at Western Approach at any one time.
 Note that the need for a truck stop should not be used a way of gaining a consent in the
 green buffer.
- Spine Road from Western Approach towards Hallen has been omitted from the phase 3
 local plan this has been expected since its first proposal in the mid 1990's. Non delivery of
 this will push traffic back onto the A403.
- Lack of daycare provision, particularly when so many are coming to work from outside the area, including South Wales. Proper local provision of daycare would also benefit our communities.
- Severn Beach railway station could be a useful transport hub, but it remains the only station in South Gloucestershire with no car park. The local plan should provide sustainable transport infrastructure.
- Severn Beach seafront. The draft local plan fails to address the need for tourism and leisure facilities outside of town centres. Unlike many sectors day tourism expenditure has increased despite the cost-of-living crisis and this oversight in provision will harm the economic fortunes of the district. Rural leisure activities tend to be good for health so if the plan's objective to impact quality of life is to be achieved there should be a focus on delivering the infrastructure needed for this and in turn to allow the rural and seaside economies to prosper.
- Consultation runs until the 16th February 2024.

<u>1990's construction Bridge Condition</u> – The Clerk has had a response from Highways England, firstly, to apologise for the disruption suffered by residents, secondly to lay out the structure inspection routine with General Inspections every 2 years and a Principal Inspection every 6 years. Lastly that condition data would have to be the subject of a Freedom of Information request.

<u>Tennis Court Fingerpost sign</u> – The Clerk's request to South Glos for a fingerpost sign for Pilning Tennis Court has been rejected as "signage clutter".

<u>Planter maintenance</u> – The Clerk has had no response to the In View article asking for volunteers. <u>King Charles III England Coastal Path</u> – The Clerk has received a reply from Mark King at SGC with a response from Natural England about the design of the costal path being to predominantly for the benefit of the wildlife and not people walking the route. Pressure still needs to be put on Natural England and Network Rail to properly complete the foot crossing at Chittening. Orchard Pools – ND and PT are meeting with South Glos Cabinet member on 6th February 2024.

9 AGENDA ITEMS

.1 To decide on pursuing a claim for registration of Redwick Common

PT raised a concern that South Glos Council may one day be looking for parcels of land to sell for development. Known historically as Redwick Common, the wide verge between the A403 and Whitehouse Lane is one area. Noted that it is in one of the worst spots for flooding in the parish and has significant underground services running through it.

Resolved to investigate registering the land as Redwick Common

 Details were shared of the next meeting of the LCNAP on 22nd February to encourage all
 Councillors to get involved.

Concern was expressed about items from one contributor but accepting that the In View team has editorial responsibility, which the Parish Council does not want to challenge. Noted that it is in the Parish Council's interest to have In View continue publishing its content, whether members agree with the editorial choices made by the magazine or not.

The team from Compton Publishing (at the meeting in person) were thanked for their continued efforts.

.4 To respond to PT.7054 Temporary Closure - Various Footpaths, Aust and Severn Beach

Noted that this closure is needed to complete the works, there is still much to be completed. The timescale appears excessive, but the route will not be closed for the entirety of the order.

.5 To decide on writing to Pilning Surgery for an update on future plans.

It was reported that the surgery would be transferring to Hanham Health after Dr Mitchell's retirement.

.6 To decide on future action regarding low level noise.

Complaints have been received regarding low level noise again, particularly when the wind direction is from the South. It appears to be on a different frequency than previously. Residents and Councillors are encouraged to report this issue to South Glos and the Environment Agency. **Resolved for the Clerk to write to SGC officers with details of the issue.**

<u>Cross Hands</u> – There has been activity at the site, the hope is that it will be cleared. <u>SGC-196160-P0B6</u> - complaint submitted for the metal fire escape fitted to the side of Pilning shop. Now subject to a planning application. This appears to be creating a new access to an upstairs flat, possibly dividing the building into two dwellings.

.10 Reports from external meetings

SevernNet – Councillors had a fact-finding meeting with Kate Royston from SevernNet. Note VB's company will be undertaking some minor admin functions for SevernNet from $1^{\rm st}$ February.

- The importance of working with all the neighbours across Severnside, Bristol and North Somerset was expressed and for SevernNet being the voice of stakeholders to local authorities.
- Encouraging businesses to look for and train staff from the local area.
- Three quarters of SevernNet's efforts are spent on sorting out transport issues.
- Responding to local plans
- Encouraging the Ride and Stride programme, encouraging sustainable transport and campaigning for more cycle routes.
- Promoting free bike schemes from local authorities and season tickets from GWR.
- More work to be carried out on improving the bus services in and out of the area. Note that
 when a company runs a private bus it is regulated in a completely different way to a public
 service.
- A question was asked regarding the percentage of where people working on Severnside are coming from. Depending on the business it is normally 40%-50% from South Wales with a few companies up to 60% from South Wales. Concern is regularly expressed about the potential of bridge closures.
- Transport for Wales runs the fast bus from Bristol to Newport, but they may not be receiving the message that running it via Western Approach could be helpful to workers and financially beneficial to TfW.
- Councillors feel that a revitalised Pilning station could be a key component in improving transport to Western Approach to and from South Wales. SevernNet are fully aware of the potential of Pilning station. There is however an uphill struggle with getting the various stakeholders interested in developing Pilning station.
- The local plan, SevernNet and the Parish Council are interested in working together to formulate a coordinated response to South Glos' Local Plan.
- Getting SevernNet's input into the Neighbourhood Plan could also be beneficial.
- Discussion was had regarding the lack of any child day care on Severnside.
- SevernNet is seeking the support of the Parish Council with finding a long-term solution to creating a truck stop within Western Approach.
- E-scooters need a co-ordinated response as to where they can operate, parts of the A403 are potentially lethal north of the junction with Govier Way. However, it should be possible to operate safely between Severn Beach station and Western Approach.
- Advanced warning that Network Rail are planning a 72-hour closure of the A403 at Hallen Marsh to replace the bridge. Meetings are taking place as to how this can be achieved without too much disruption.
- Concern was expressed that the spine road from M49 to Hallen / Severn Road, promised in the previous Local Plan and Core strategy, has somehow slipped into the too difficult category. The Parish Council wants to see a strong response to make sure this key piece of infrastructure is delivered as planned.
- Agreed to hold further meetings between the Parish Council and SevernNet approximately every quarter.

PT attended a SevernNet business breakfast meeting, offer for a future date for Councillors to have a conducted tour around Wainwrights.

Appendix C NPSG Report

NP SG Report to Parish Council 5th February 2024

Last SG meeting 16th January

Grant: The NPSG has informally applied for (and had accepted) a further Grant application of £10,000. This will contribute to the costs that will specifically relate to the issue of flooding within the area. It is anticipated that this will be called off/formally applied for in the April to May period 2024.

Furthermore, the existing Grant closes at the end of March 2024 and any unspent funds returned. This will be by forecast, no more than a couple of hundred pounds.

Green Belt: The Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group (NPSG) had a meeting with Patrick Conroy of South Gloucestershire Council on the 25th of January following its preparation of a draft Green Belt Policy Paper and the production of a Green Belt review document.

SGC remain committed to supporting the Neighbourhood Plan (NP) and helping the Group find constructive ways to meet the housing needs of the Parish. The NPSG also commissioned a report that details the exceptional circumstances that it believes exist to justify amendments to the current Green Belt boundaries.

All these documents are currently being reviewed and assessed by SGC so that they can be included as part of the NP and will eventually be on the website for public access.

Flood Risk: Again, members of the NPSG have been working hard to both understand and mitigate potential flood risk issues within the Parish to support future housing development that has been identified in both the Housing Needs Assessment and Parish Survey that were undertaken in 2021. Copies of these and other documents can be found at https://www.psbpc.co.uk/npsg-documents This resulted in a draft Flood Risk Assessment being developed and a meeting with the Environment Agency at the end of January. We have agreed with them that an Exception Test for each village will be produced as soon as the latest flood modelling data is available. This is expected next month and will reflect the protection afforded by the improved defences, and the Exception Test will demonstrate whether sites can be developed safely without increasing flood risk to others which is a key planning test.

SGC Local Plan Consultation: The deadline to comment on the SGC new Local Plan is the 14th of February and details of this can be found at https://beta.southglos.gov.uk/new-local-plan/ The NPSG were disappointed that SGC have not identified the need for limited new housing development within our Parish, but the draft New Local Plan does identify that the Parish is in the process of producing its' Neighbourhood Plan and the importance of this to the area. We were also disappointed that SGC did not (despite invitation) hold a public communication meeting in the Parish

The NPSG has drafted a response to the consultation for submission and this will be available for viewing on the NPSG website once the consultation window has closed.

Communication: The NPSG has now set up a monthly mail shot to registered email addresses so that residents can be kept informed of the Groups progress. This is in addition to the In view monthly submission.

Next steps: The NPSG will continue to conclusion its work on Green belt and Flood Risk to support the production of the NP.

Next meetings 20th February and 19th March. At the Emmaus Hall.

Appendix D District Councillor Report Pilning & Severn Beach Parish Council Report | Monday 5th February 2024

Key updates for Parish Council colleagues in February 2024;

- Local Plan consultation events have taken place in Almondsbury and Easter Compton in the last 3 weeks, inviting feedback from local people and an opportunity to liaise with South Gloucestershire Council Officers. I attended both events to hear from residents across the Pilning, Severn Beach and Easter Compton area. The deadline for feedback is 16th Feb 2024 on the Emerging Preferred Strategy (EPS).
- I have remained in contact with Officer's and residents at Salthouse Farm Park. Matters relating to the owner of the site continue and I'll be working more closely with everyone involved to help improve the situation for residents who feel they're not being consulted with as the should.
- Following last months' heavy rainfall, I sought an update from SGC Streetcare team in relation to scheduled maintenance and prevention of flooding for local homes. The Council recognise the challenges and impact of flooding and is doing all it can to ensure drains and gulleys remain clear, but it restricted by the lack of central funding to go above and beyond. I will be attending the Lower Severn Drainage Board meeting next week and will seek further support for the area.
- I am pleased to report following lots of work by Councillors, Officers and local people, funding has been secured to extend the 918-bus service for the area. This vital service provides travel for young people from Severn Beach to access Castle School in Thornbury.
- Claire Young, Leader of the Council joined me in Pilning talking to local people during January.
 Residents highlighted challenges including speeding, the state of the Redwick Road and the need for better enforcement in the area, all of which has been taken on board and fed back to Officers'.
- I'm scheduled to meet online with Alison Caitlin (SGC Officer), relating to S.106 arts funding for the ward and would welcome anyone from the Parish to join us online if available.
- More broadly in the Council, a large amount of focus in on both the SGC Local Plan (referenced above), and the Budget. Financially the landscape within Local Authorities is challenging, with difficult decisions needed to ensure we continue to provide services across the authority. The reality is the lack of central funding into Las, ever-increasing costs, and the additional pull on services we are trying to navigate a difficult position.

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
