

PILNING & SEVERN BEACH PARISH COUNCIL

Meeting held on Monday 1st March 2010, commencing at 6.30 pm
in PILNING Village Hall

Also Present:- J C Rawlinson (Clerk), 1 member of the public (Mrs Barbara Matthews). Also in attendance were Mrs Rebecca Champion of Wainbridge Crescent, Mrs Lyn & Mr Bob Lloyd of Cross Hands Road. Also present – representing St Peter’s School Travel Plan Working Group – were Ed French, Sharon Barber, Robert Griffin, Lance Palmer and Kate Urry.

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Ed French spoke of the group’s promotion of walking and cycling to St Peter’s School. In view of the distance involved in using the main entrance in Bank Road, the group is hopeful of gaining an access right through the back of the premises, travelling via Cross Hands Road. Whilst accepting the need for much work to enhance the safety aspects of the route, EF confirmed funding is available to pay for this work.

CW presented the case for the parish council, supported by the Clerk who read out the report of the meeting held on 13th October 2008. Following this meeting - with the Head Teacher, Chairman of Governors and 2 representatives of S Glos Council - the parish council were informed that any access via Cross Hands Road would be totally impractical. Whilst the parish was happy to support access for children via the bridge over the Pill, it acknowledged the limited width would create too many problems with parents dropping-off children then turning round and driving out as children were on their way in. Whether the field gate was open or closed, either condition would create its own problems. Accordingly it had been assumed that no further thought would be given to creating an access at this point. Pat Case had requested emergency access via the bridge with a formal agreement to be drawn up. Nothing further has been heard about this, and renewed interest in access along Cross Hands Road is also a surprise.

The difficulties relating to this access could be overcome with the provision of a pedestrian bridge. This would require the release of land by a private landowner. Without this it is difficult to see how progress could be made.

SB asked if kerbside barriers could be placed at both ends of the church path. LP suggested this would actually reduce the width of the footway, yet the main safety aim is to increase the width. Confirmed to those present that barriers are a highways issue, but a new gate system allowing permanent access would be in place before the school is opened. With a site meeting with Oliver Mann imminent, agreed IH would raise the question of barriers when discussing the new entrance.

With the time now at 7.12 pm the Chairman thanked EF for his input and all others for their attendance. It was agreed that much more dialogue is needed regarding the school and its place in the community.

All members of the public, other than BM, adjourned into the committee room for a private meeting. After a very short break the council meeting continued.

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The Chairman asked all present to remember Mr William Bayliss of Prospect Road Mr Gwyn Jones of Rustic Park, Mr Gary of Faith House, Mr Ron Howse of Beach Road and Mr Grahame Rowley of Salthouse Farm Park, all recently deceased.

6. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

7. AGENDA7 – 1 Sevenside Development

Residents are greatly concerned by the attitude of Tesco. They are displaying a complete lack of regard for the area. An email from Mike Fish was read, as was comment by PT, following a site visit by him, in the company of Steve Webb MP. Agreed to register complaints with planning and Tesco themselves.

7 - 3 Parish Plan

BM confirmed the draft is now with the printers, all maps and photo's having been inserted. The finished article is expected at any time.

7 - 4 Playgrounds/Youth Activities

NB confirmed that cash raised is now more than £3,000. The next item of equipment is costed at £5,200, NB asking if the parish would donate £2000. Proposed CW, seconded IR, 4 For, 4 Against (JB, SC, DH, NW), NB Abstained. On the casting vote of the Chairman, agreed.

NB confirmed that fund raising is still underway, the latest idea being the '(Not Quite) Full Monty', a number of Dads having agreed to take part.

7 - 5 Village Matters

Bank Road – SC drew attention to mud on the road in the vicinity of the new-build school. FB asked for the burned-out caravan and other rubbish to be removed from the field next to the traveller camp. Attention was also drawn to increased drainage problems in East Redham Farm, perhaps resulting from the school work.

Severn Beach Village Hall – DH confirmed the Rev Sandra Williams had discussed the possibility of holding services in the hall, although this would require planning permission. The Rev was surprised to hear of the parish council's interest in utilising the Church Road site for allotments.

Development – PT reported (through CW) on proposals to control development where it unduly influenced susceptible wildlife. Developers will need to demonstrate their project has sufficient value to proceed.

A403 – FB reported that 8 trailers are now parked in the 'timber yard'.

7 - 6 Reports

ARMY CADETS/PILNING RANGE – CW reported on the recent open day which she attended with NC and IH. All were very impressed by what is being achieved. Fifteen local youngsters are included in the project and others would benefit from being involved. Visitors were entertained by a band/marching display. DH recommended the benefits to be gained from membership. He had served in the 1950s, his service allowed him to 'fast track' to officer training in his national service. Scholarships are now also available to cadets.
