

PARISH COUNCIL MEETING 4th January 1971
in the PILNING VILLAGE HALL.

APOLOGY from Mrs. Barry.

598 WAINBRIDGE CRESCENT. BLOCKED DITCH.
A meeting with Mr. Court of the Surveyors Dept. has been arranged,
and ditch will be inspected.

415 WAINBRIDGE CRESCENT. EYESORE.
The Parish Council has been referred to a further person for
information, and this will be taken up.

515 AREA RECREATION CENTRE SCHEME. COMMITTEE.
Mr. Denner spoke in favour of a 100 acre site being obtained by
the R.D.C.

It was decided to ask for more details. A suggestion made that
parishes should be represented at some future meeting of the Committee.

517 BUTCHERS LANE. OBSTRUCTION.
Mr. Singer reports he has ascertained this lane is the property of
British Rail, and no portion has been rented to Mrs. Parsons, who has erected
obstruction.

436 WEIGHT RESTRICTION. REDWICK ROAD.
The attention of the Authority concerned is to be drawn to the bad
state of the road, and action to get a restriction is an immediate necessity.
A census at this time is thought would be misleading, and evening and night
traffic being omitted, a true count is therefore impossible.

433 PLAYING EQUIPMENT (CHILDREN'S). PILNING.
After much discussion the Council stated equipment on the Playing
Field is the responsibility of the Hall and Field Committee for upkeep and
maintenance.

504 ABLETON LANE. NEW STREET.
Objection was raised at the amount of land being taken from
residences "Glanafra", "Framore", and Nos. 1 and 2 Severnwood Gardens, and
it was felt ground opposite could be used to align the road; also more
information should be obtained from Gloucester C.C.

391 LIAISON COMMITTEE REPORT.
The Minutes of their last meeting with the I.C.I. have not yet
been received.

500 PILNING CEMETERY - COMPLAINT.
A Meeting of the Sub-committee has not yet taken place, but will
in the near future.

510 DAMAGED BUS SHELTER.
An inspection has been made by the Norwich Union Inspector to
assess the damage.

514 PRECEPT YEAR 1971/72.
There was considerable discussion on this matter, but on the
casting vote of the Chairman a Precept for £600. was approved. It was,
however, decided that at the December 1971 meeting Councillors should
submit their estimates of amounts they might feel would be required for
~~year 1972/3.~~ *future years.*

503 SEVERN BEACH PROMENADE. *14 steps*
Mrs. Harris is now the Secretary of the Swimming Pool and Beach
Committee, and Mr. Dyde advised by 'phone the derelict site is to be cleared
up.

413 DEVELOPMENT IN ABLETON LANE.
The enquiry made by Mr. Snell corrected a report in Newspapers,
which showed 41 houses were to be erected. Correct number being 23 only.

GRANTS TO SEVERN BEACH HALL AND PLAYING FIELD COMMITTEE.

519 The Councillors decided they agree to let the whole £151.
Grant from the Glos. Education Office remain in the hands of the
Committee such as was done with grants obtained by Pilning Hall and
Field Committee.

442 Mr. Frost advises this matter is still in hand with Mr.
Goulding, and will advise when matter is settled.

GORMLEY CAFE.

471 Mr. Huntingdon states a Notice has been served on the owner under
the instructions of the R.D.C. Health Committee.

PATH BEACH ROAD BETWEEN NOS. 39 AND 41.

482 A.T. Elliott, Solicitors, are searching their records to see who
owns the path, and will advise result later.

SALVIDGE'S GATE, OBSTRUCTION.

394 This matter is still in hand between the Solicitors of Glos. C.C.
and those of Mr. Salvidge.

GYPSY ENCAMPMENT.

502 The County Planning Officer Mr. Norman Collins advises receipt of
the Parish Council's objection, which will be brought before the County
Planning Committee at their next meeting.

OLD PDOPLE'S WELFARE.

483 Mr. Free and Mr. Snell reported a lot more work is still to be done.
137 addresses had to be visited. Several persons had offered to help do a
survey.

WAINBRIDGE CRESCENT. STREET LIGHT.

520 This unlit lamp, and the faulty one at the A403 and B5099 junction
are to be reported.

HOLE IN ROAD OPPOSITE REDWICK STORES.

516 A hole outside Mr. Grimstead's garage covered by a steel sheet is
considered dangerous, and the Clerk will see the R.D.C. Clerk of the Sewage
Works on this matter.

OSBORNE ROAD. WEIGHT RESTRICTION.

532 In consequence of the heavy vehicles using this road, and possible
damage to pavements it was felt desirable to ask for a Weight Restriction
Order to be applied.
