517 <u>BUTCHERS LANE. OBSTRUCTION.</u>

Ar. Singer reports he has ascertained this lane is the property of British Rail, and no portion has been rented to Mrs. Parsons, who has erected obstruction.

The attention of the Authority conserned is to be drawn to the bad state of the road, and action to get a restriction is an immediate necessity. A census at this time is thought would be misleading, and evening and night traffic being omitted, a true count is therefore impossible.

PLAYING EQUIPMENT (CHILDREN'S). PILNING.

After much discussion the Council stated equipment on the Playing Field is the responsibility of the Hall and Field Committee for upkeep and maintenance.

ABLETON LANE, NEW STREET.

Objection was raised at the amount of land being taken from residences "Glanafran", "Framore", and Nos. 1 and 2 Severnwood Gardens, and it was felt ground opposite could be used to align the road; also more information should be obtained from Gloucester C.C.
