Our Neighbourhood Plan (NP) will set out the vision for our parish, for the future uses and development types for land within our area. It's a challenging project and an opportunity to decide and plan, with the backing of residents, how Pilning & Severn Beach might be developed and the supporting infrastructure needed.

Progress update:

- We've identified what we believe are the areas of Key Issues for the NP. These include housing needs, potential sights for development, public transport, roads and car parking, cycle ways and footpaths, green spaces and tree planting, community facilities, retail and small businesses, large commercial developments.
- We've had a first meeting with a planning specialist working on behalf of SGC, to obtain guidance and advice for developing our Plan. We're advised to focus only on planning related issues and to ensure transparency and public engagement from the early stages.
- We're now commencing the evidence building phase of the project, which means; gathering information, commissioning studies and conducting surveys.
- We've submitted our first grant application to secure funds to support further engagement with you, our residents; and, to procure expertise from specialist consultants. A first step will be to commission a Housing Needs Assessment.
