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Planning Applications:

At its meetings, the Steering Group considers new major planning applications for their alignment with the direction of the Neighbourhood Plan (NP). A recent application for Churngold offices on a brown field site met with our expectations and is supported.

Future Proofing for Climate Change:

Asked for the Design Codes work, to provide examples of new buildings in the Parish to have future proofing in their design, the Steering Group could identify just a few. The main reason being the low number of new builds in recent years.

Project Plan:

S.Glos Council has determined that both Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) and Habitats Regulations Assessment (HRA) will be needed for our NP. As a result, Issue 5 of the Project Plan now predicts completion as May 2024.

Aims and Objectives:

We are now seeking professional support from a planning consultant to review these and advise on how they can progress into forming the policies of the NP. Open public consultation will follow this work and is now expected around March next year.

General Progress:

We are currently in a phase where work is progressing on many fronts e.g. Design Codes, evaluation of sites, preparing the Neighbourhood Development Plan. We should be in a position to report on these in the New Year.
