7. AGENDA

7 – 1 Severnside Development

CW noted with concern that bikers are again creating a nuisance at Western Approach. DH has spoken to PC Lodge concerning this problem, and it was agreed the problem would be drawn to the attention of Police at the meeting this Thursday.

7 – 2 Village Halls/Playing Fields

Nothing to report.

7 – 3 Parish Plan

Agreed the Parish Spring Event held at SB School was a great success and there was a good attendance. Those members of the Parish Plan Group who were present at the meeting were thanked for their efforts.

7 – 4 Youth Activities

On behalf of the absent NB, CW informed members that a bid for funding had been submitted recently. This is in respect of a possible bike track or youth shelter. PT provided some assistance in completing the application. DH stated that a youth bus had appeared at SB. With no cost to us this is a bonus.

7 – 5 Information Day

AG confirmed that increased interest had now been shown, some 24 organisations having agreed to be involved. AG suggested that an autumn event might work well, suggesting 8th September as a likely date. This time activities will be centred at the 2 village halls. Although Trinity Hall had been well-attended on the previous occasion Mafeking Hall had not. Two centres instead of 4 should provide a more efficient organisation, and it was agreed a time table should be established for the transport, rather than the 'hit and miss' system that operated last time. AG suggested a bouncy castle for both venues, funded by the parish council. This was agreed. The scouts are to be asked to lay on a barbecue facility.

7 – 6 Access through Gate at Sea Wall

IH has been asked whether it would be possible for a key to be supplied to allow for access for a boat, which could then be launched from the slipway. Following a 'phone conversation with IH, Clerk has checked on the ownership of the gate and confirmed it belongs to the Environment Agency. A key is provided for the parish council only on the basis that access is not permitted to others. Accordingly any permission for such access needs to be sought from the EA.

7 – 7 Village Matters

Overgrowth – MH indicated that overgrowth on the church path is creating problems for pedestrians. Agreed that the church be contacted to arrange for clearance.

- On a similar theme, CW drew attention to the growth near SB Station. This also to be notified.

Footpaths – AG produced a list of problems prepared by Mr Neave. Clerk to contact Highways for these items to be included amongst those requiring attention.

Tree Planting – CW asked why, when other planting in the area had taken place, the Doug Britton memorial tree had not been replaced. PT is to raise this matter with the relevant department.

Traffic Problems/Transport Policy – GM has received complaints relating to a lack of visibility when the bus is parked near the end of Severnwood Gardens. However, with a service only every 2 hours and no room to park off-road it is incumbent upon drivers to use care in dealing with the problems. Suggested that the 30 mph flashing sign in Ableton Lane is not currently working.

Bus Services – AG commented on the rail link bus which parks at the burger bar, often with its engine running. It was also noted that road markings have still not been put in place.

7 – 8 Reports

PT has attended a conference on 'renewables' and also visited University of West of England. He commented on the wonderful campus at UWE and mentioned that part of the course work includes a visit to the Bridges Visitor Centre.

The EA has drawn attention to the need for further consideration to be given to the local flood risk assessment.

An archaeology walk is planned for 21st April - further details will be found in *The Gazette*.

A Parish Charter meeting is set for 25th April in Bradley Stoke. To date this parish council has paid scant attention to charter group affairs.

An inspection of the port facilities at Portishead is imminent. This is in connection with a proposed deep sea container project.
